Parish in the Western Division of the County, in the Hundred of Elstu, Bradford Petty Sessional division, Union and County Court District, Rural Deanery of Potterne (Bradford Portion), Archdeaconry of Wiltshire and Diocese of Salisbury.

Parish Church with 100 sittings, the vicarage separated from Bradford in 1876 and worth £220 yearly with 19 acres of glebe; Parish Room 1892. Baptist Chapel built 1865 holds 90, with Sunday School added 1885. Wesleyan Chapel at Upper Westwood 1862, holds 150. Cemetery of half an acre 1883, cost £250.

Area: 823 acres of land and 9 of water; rateable value £1,707; population in 1901: 485 (including 6 officers and 80 inmates of the workhouse).
